GEAR LIST FOR TURKEY HUNTERS

<u>What to bring</u>: The Lodge will provide bedding, towels, etc., but you will need to bring personal toiletry items. You are welcome to bring alcohol as we do not provide that in your hunt package. Also bring snacks and drinks for your blind.

The following turkey hunter's checklist will help you get prepared. It is not uncommon to have snow at the beginning of the season, and hot toward the end so layers are recommended.

Our terrain is open with a lot of trees. **Because of the open terrain, all hunters are asked to remain in their blinds at all times!!!** Guarantee the turkeys will see you before you see them. **Tick spray and allergy medication if you have allergies is very highly recommended due to the spring weather.**

- Hunter's safety card (if applicable)
- Shotgun with case
- Shotgun shells (If you are flying, pack shells in original package in your suitcase, separate from your gun. Do not put shells in gun case).
- Turkey calls... any and all! Never know what will bring them in!
- You are welcome to bring your own decoys but we also have them
- Flashlight and/or headlamp as we often go in while it's dark
- Binoculars
- Rangefinder
- Camera and cell phone. If you have AT&T service will be limited
- Cooler (for storing and transporting meat home)
- Comfortable waterproof boots or shoes
- Thick socks
- Camo jacket
- Camo facemask
- Rain gear (only a suggestion)
- Any medications and please make us aware of any medical conditions
- Personal items (shampoo, toothpaste, tooth brush, etc.)
- You are welcome to bring your favorite chair but we do provide them
- If you like to target practice, bring all of your guns! We have a rifle range, long range shooting targets (300 700-yard gongs) and a skeet range. This is always a fun activity mid-day if you're not in blinds hunting.
- Hearing protection
- We highly recommend purchasing your permits in advance
